

A question often asked by early interventionists, tasked with supporting families in a LSL approach is, "*Where do I start?*" Historically, perhaps these providers have searched for various materials, books, websites, and articles to begin their journeys in learning how to implement LSL intervention services. This process can be overwhelming for early interventionists, who have high case loads across multiple locations, with little extra time to seek out information. Moreover, there is no guarantee the information they are finding is of high quality or results in the carryover of effective LSL intervention for children who are DHH. A need exists for vetted resources.


