Improving Access to Pediatric Audiology Services in Rural Oklahoma

INTRODUCTION

In August 2019, OSDH launched the Pediatric Audiology Program with one audiologist traveling to sites to lessen the burden on families having to drive 4-5 hours one way for audiology services and decreasing wait times for an appointment to < one month. In May 2022, the program expanded to three additional audiologists and accepted a fourth year AuD externship in 2024.

The program provides diagnostic services to children birth through 18 years of age, no out-of-pocket expense and all insurances accepted.

There are now 15 clinics equipped with state-of-theart diagnostic audiology equipment: 10 county health department clinics, two SoonerStart (Part C) offices, and three offsite clinics

STAKEHOLDERS

OSDH Pediatric Audiology works with internal and external stakeholders by accepting referrals and providing outreach and education. The program is a vital resource for Oklahoma Newborn Hearing Screening and SoonerStart (Part C) programs with 69% of the caseload being 3 years of age and under. (Chart 2)

DISCUSSION

From August 2019 through December 2024, the program provided 8,146 appointments, 56% occurring in rural clinics (Table 1), serving 6,104 children. Of those, 78% had normal hearing and 32% had an auditory disorder that needed further treatment. The audiologist navigated the families to appropriate providers for medical treatment and/or hearing technology when needed.
