The Ins and Outs of Datalogging and How It Can Be Used as a Counseling Tool



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Datalogging: What is it?

- Datalogging is a tool used to help give information about equipment usage time to an Audiologist.
- Datalogging for some companies can be a tool used to see what environments equipment is used in.
- Reality of datalogging: Each pediatric amp company collects and analyzes info from datalogging chip differently.
 - Cautious interpretation.

Pediatric BTE Hearing Aids



 Datalogging within hearing aid software may be 1 singular number OR a little more...






Pediatric Bone Conduction Hearing Aids



 Datalogging: # + hourly columns of usage to compare or # + scene analysis (SA)






Pediatric Cochlear Implants





Datalogging could be any combo of#, SA, &



Datalogging: It's not one size fits all!



 There are no 2 companies of datalogging analysis that look exactly alike!



 Comparisons of datalogging from kid to kid wearing different manufacturer's equipment aren't fair comparisons.


Datalogging Quirks

- Streaming, FM receiver, or accessory attachment can turn off datalogging chip
- If there is no scene or hours analysis with the datalogging #, how accurate is the info...really?

• Is the equipment on, but hidden in a toy chest or trapped in Mom's purse?



Datalogging Quirks (cont.)



 If child changes from main HA or CI processor to back up, datalogging is no longer accurate. Can't just add up the hours.





What are we supposed to do?

- Become really good friends with an Audiologist!!!
- Audiologists should interpret datalogging with caution.
 - If datalogging says kid wears his hearing aid 10 hours a day (with no other info or analysis), but Mom reports he constantly takes the equipment off and hides it...
 - If datalogging says the equipment is on 8 hours a day, but manufacturer datalogging analysis says 90% of the time the environment is noise...

Final Example: a teachable moment Datalogging is helpful!



Datalogging Audio Summary

- It's a good tool, but should be used and interpreted by an Audiologist.
- Consult your child's Pediatric Audiologist for datalogging info and any questions.
- Encourage full time, all waking hours usage.
- Talk to child's family, caregivers, all team members and include their report of equipment usage with datalogging information for accuracy.

Importance of All Waking Hours

- National average for wear time
 - Between birth to age 5
- What does all waking hours look like at each age and stage?
 - Wear time handout
- Must establish an open and honest relationship with the family you are working with

Using Datalogging as a Counseling Tool

- Recognize that it is not an easy task
- Judgment free zone
- Allow family to set goals for wear time
 - Encourage small, realistic goals to reach overall goal of all waking hours
 - "How can we help you?"
- Identify barriers together

Overcoming the Barriers of Full Time Technology Usage

- Identify the primary caregiver and get them on board
- Begin to log daily wear time to identify parts of the day that are more difficult
- Establish new routines to encourage technology use
- Continue raising the bar
- Retention options
- Remember the sense of urgency and the investment parents are making in their child's future

Take Away Points

- There is no listening and spoken language outcome without full-time usage.
- Form an open and honest relationship with all your team members
- Datalogging should be used as a tool for counseling, not a tool for judgment
- Every child/family is different and has different needs
