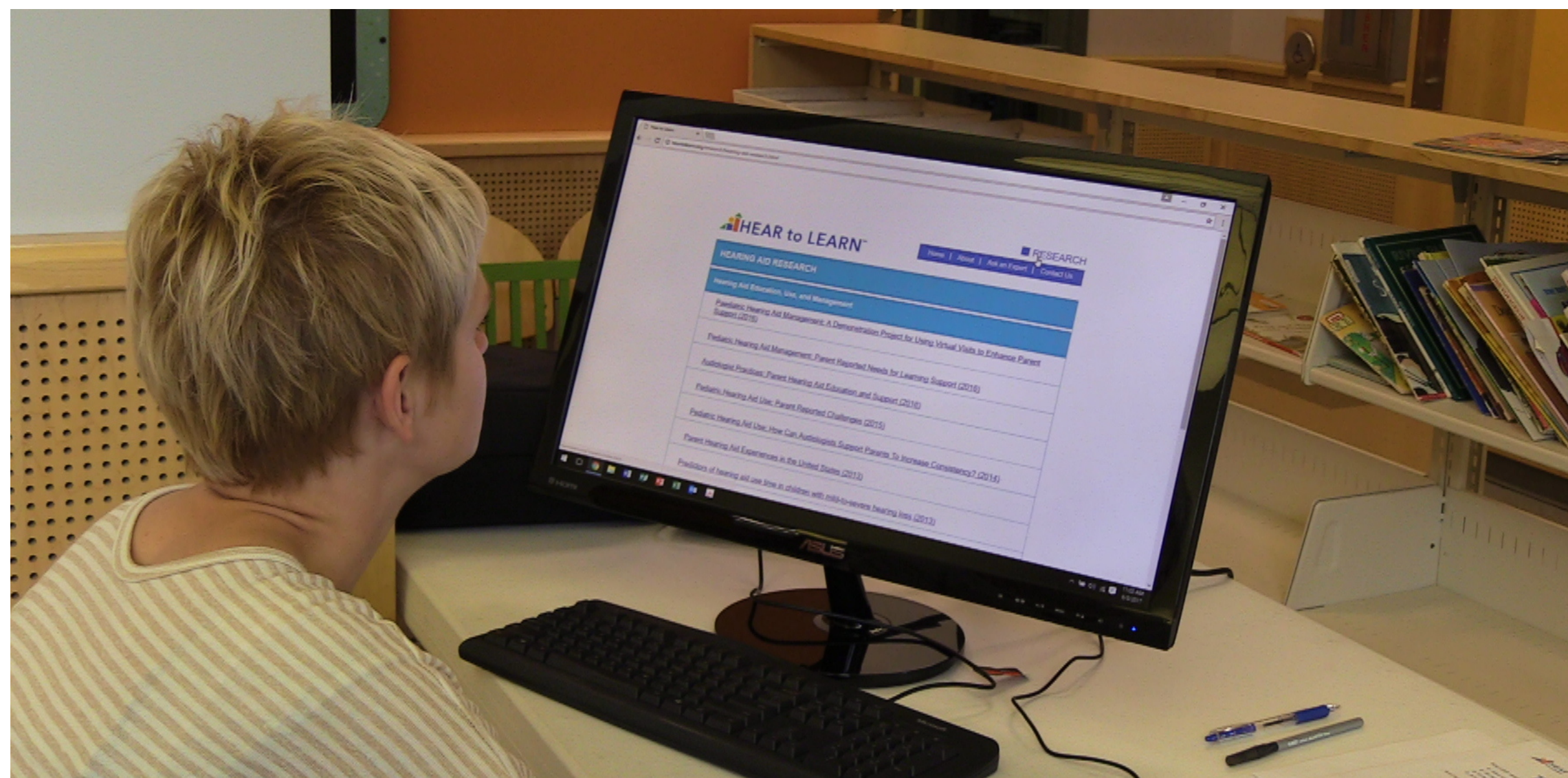

Among other resources, team members develop evidence-based video tutorials to help parents:

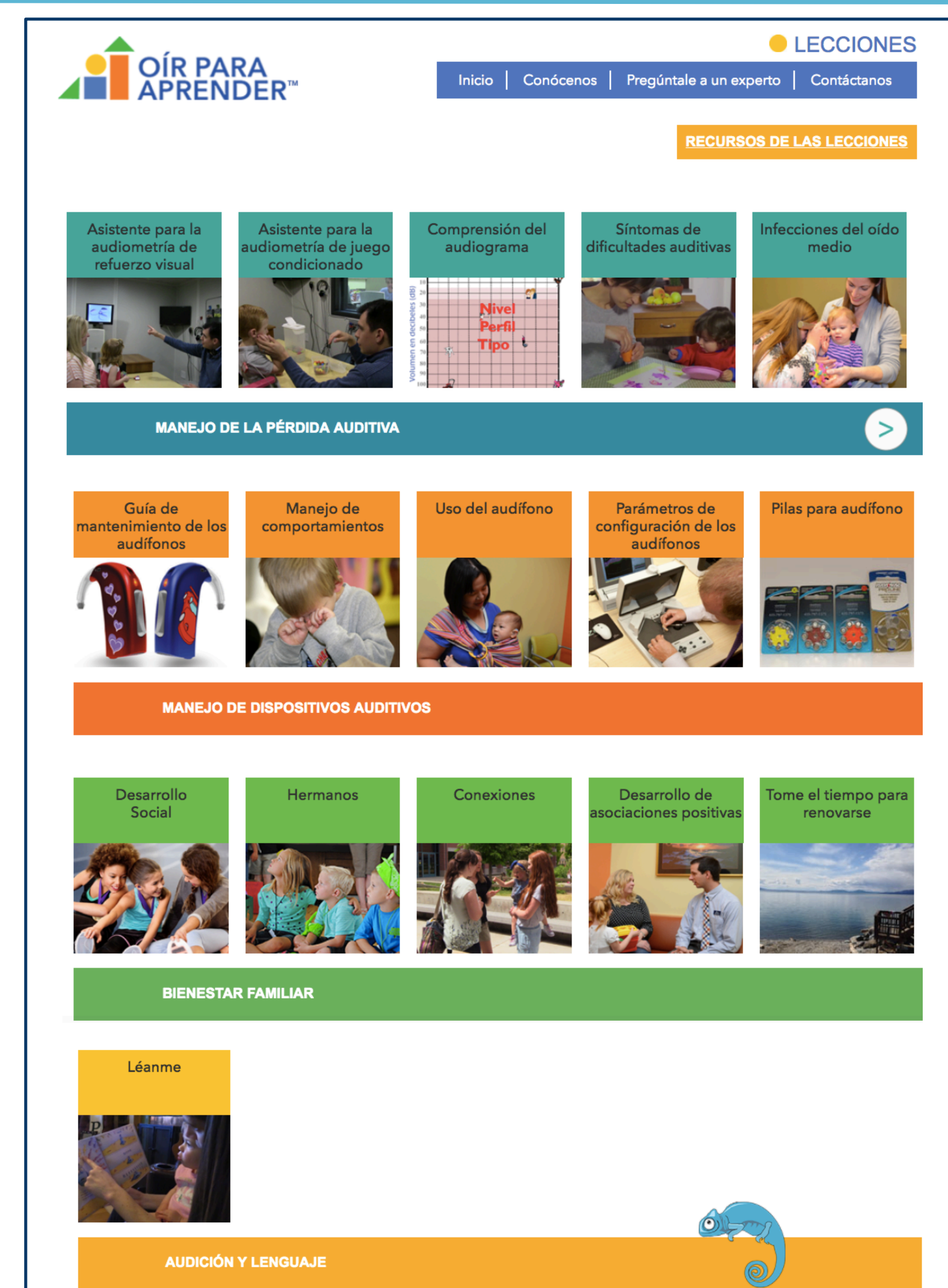
- Learn new information
