

Appropriate terminology

- Deaf is the *appropriate* term because it reflects:
 - Culture
 - Deaf identity
 - Daily experiences
 - Deaf community
 - Visual predominance and orientation
 - American Sign Language = natural
 - English = acquisition
 - Inclusive

The medical viewpoint of deafness focuses on the condition of hearing loss that needs to be cured without recognizing the whole child.

ESTEEM

A command of language allows us to communicate unique ideas, be respected by others & develop executive function skills.

BELONGING

Language instills a sense of belonging by allowing us to discuss ideas & develop trust among peers and family.

SAFETY

Language allows us to understand and predict the world around us & and to not be in a constant state of anxiety.

PHYSIOLOGICAL

Language allows us to be comforted & communicate basic needs such as hunger and cold.

Maslow's model was created by studying highly successful individuals and identifying factors in their success. Using Maslow's approach we look at the research on academic and social outcomes of well adjusted D/HH individuals and how critical language is in their climb towards self-actualization. D/HH children who use only spoken English and experience being socially ostracized often have limited abilities and opportunities to move up this pyramid.

Procedures

All elementary school staff received training on DRDP-SA tool

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP)
Reading, Language and Math (Grades 3-5)

Results: Correlations Three-Year Data



There is a significant correlation between years at CSD and the DRDP scales.



ASL scores strong correlations with Reading, Language and Math.

95%

ASL scores significant correlations 95% of the domains.

87%

Reading scores significant correlations 87% of the domains.


