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Introduction

The Birth to Three Program at ASD has written a 5-year strategic plan with CT EHDI.

The strategic plan will develop, implement, expand, refine and systematize statewide support for CT EHDI initiatives.

CT EHDI and ASD will use

- data collection and analysis,
- outreach,
- education, and
- partnershipbuilding with parents, medical providers, early intervention providers, and family-based organizations

5 Year Strategic Plan 1-3-6-9 Model


- * By one month of age: all children will have a hearing screening at birth; infants who failed their hearing screening also receive cCMV testing.
- * By three months of age, infants who fail their hearing screenings are evaluated by a pediatric audiologist and receive a diagnostic audiological follow-up test
- * By six months of age, ensure that infants diagnosed with a hearing loss are receiving early intervention services (Connecticut Office of Early Childhood's Birth to Three programs)
- * By nine months of age, ensure families of the deaf or hard of hearing are enrolled in family supports.

Why Is This Collaboration Important?

Developmental delays due to hearing loss may be lessened with the timely detection and appropriate intervention services.



Early Intervention (2011-2020):

- 87% of infants
 with a hearing loss
 were referred to
 Connecticut Birth to
 Three (B23).
 - 67% of infants referred to B23 were enrolled in services.
- 45% of hearing loss infants enrolled in B23 did so before six months.
