 - Sometimes it's not talking at all.. It's listening





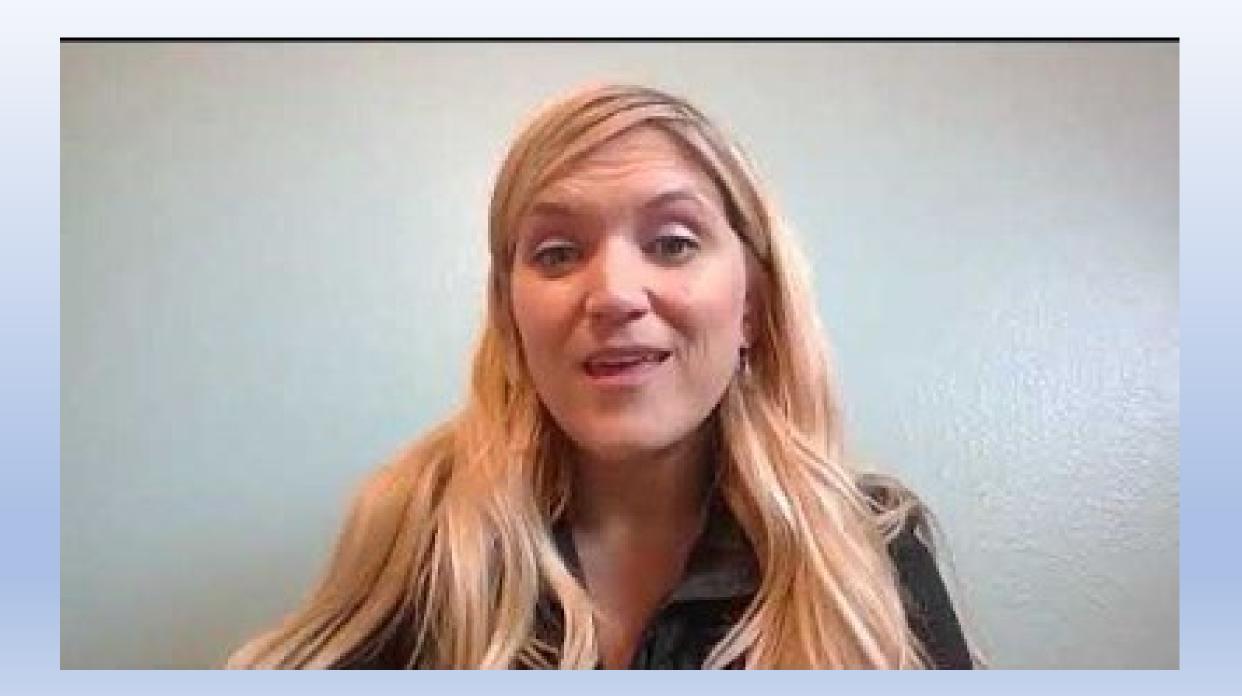
