David's Story: Profound Hearing Loss

- David was born with Profound Sensorineural Hearing Loss(SNHL), caused by the Connexin 26 (Cx26).
- We got the diagnosis when he was about 2 months old.
- At 3 months old, he started using hearing aids and receiving speech therapies with Early Intervention and I started receiving support from a parent educator from Beginnings.

David's Story: Profound Hearing Loss

- He received his first Cochlear Implant when he was 14 months old and got activated shortly after, showing amazing results.
- He received the second Cochlear Implant when he was 32 months old, it came to complement the first one.
- At 3 years old, he started going to the public school.
