What do we know about schools for the deaf?

- 1-2 per state (usually)
- Many are located in rural areas, but many in cities, too.
- K-12 education
- Deaf teachers
- Has dorms
- IEPs required
- Mainly uses sign language

- Statewide resource centers
- Works with mainstream schools/programs
- Many have 0-3 services and preschool programs including Parent-Infant Programs
- 80% of teachers are hearing
- More focus on day programs, including charter schools
- 504 and other exceptions are welcome at some
- Always has English services/programs, spoken and written, including LSL certified staff

Provide educational administrators with strategies to retain current teachers



What About Teachers & Administrators?

- A 2008 study (repeated in 2018 with similar results) by Simms, et al. shows that 22.0% of teachers and 14.5% of administrators were deaf.
- The Council on Education of the Deaf reports that the number of teachers of the deaf is now at an all-time low at 600 graduates in 2021 (36% of the number in 1982 (2020)


