
### Vermont Early Hearing Detection and Intervention Program (VTEHDI):

- Work with hospitals and other community partners (early head start, homebirth midwives, primary care professionals, audiologists) to provide newborn and early periodic hearing screenings
- Provide outreach and support to families and their infants
- □ Engage families, audiologists and early intervention providers
- Deaf and Hard of Hearing Mentors
- Work with state, regional and national agencies and organizations to achieve the National EHDI goals (1,3,6)

Vermont Department of Health

- VTEHDI
- Partnership between VTEHDI and the University of Vermont Medical Center
- Part C
  - All infants in Vermont qualify if they are Deaf or Hard of Hearing
  - Funding- Medicaid
  - Early Intervention Provider
