


General Overview of the Curriculum

Who are the Community Partners?

Community Partners (CP) refers to any non-hospital-based outpatient newborn hearing screening program or providers such as:

- Midwives/Birthing Centers/Out of hospital births
- Providers in medical settings (pediatricians, community health, county health, etc.)
- Providers in social/educational settings
- Outpatient newborn hearing screening programs



Why Create the NHSTC-CP?

- Current NHSTC is hospital based
- Community partners expressed the need for a curriculum to meet their needs
- There are differences in the settings and the protocols in an outpatient screening environment
- Provides EHDI programs with a standardized and sustainable training for this population
- Provides community partners with EHDI education and
