
In English,

expression/non-manual signals.






• ASL Handshape Rhyme:

Students learned the most new English words from stories with ASL handshape rhymes. English Word Families: There
was no significant
improvement in vocabulary
from stories with rhyming
English words.

These findings suggest that ASL rhyme, rhythm, and phonological awareness may have a bigger role in language and literacy development than previously realized.
