Why EHDI-MS Developed the Family Support Program

The Problem:

Mississippi did not have a **Hands & Voices chapter** to provide family support for families of children who are deaf or hard of hearing.

The Solution:

Recognizing the gap in family support services, **EHDI-MS** developed the **Family Support Program** to empower families with personalized guidance, peer support networks, and collaborative partnerships. This program was designed to fill the void and ensure that families have access to the resources they need to navigate the hearing journey confidently and effectively.

The EHDI-MS Family Support Program

1. Personalized Family Guidance

- Tailored support to meet the unique needs of each family.
- Assistance in navigating the hearing journey, from diagnosis to intervention and beyond.

2. Peer Support Networks

- Connecting families with others who have similar experiences.
- Promotes emotional support, shared learning, and community building.





- Build partnerships to fill any gaps in services or resources.


Incorporating Feedback from Families
