Ask for co-treat between therapist at least once a quarter, this is huge to maximize therapy time and for the many different therapists to be aware and support other goals (like language goals) on all therapies the kiddo receives. You can work on language during PT, OT, DT, feeding... and give the kiddo a big push with every minute of intervention.
