Early Hearing Detection and Intervention Act

To amend the Public Health Service Act to reauthorize a program for early detection, diagnosis, and treatment regarding deaf and hard-of-hearing newborns, infants,

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

This Act may be cited as the "Early Hearing Detection and SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

SEC. 2. REAUTHORIZATION OF PROGRAM FOR EARLY DETECTION, DIAGNOSIS, AND TREATMENT REGARDING DEAF AND HARD. OF-HEARING NEWBORNS, INFANTS, AND YOUNG CHILDREN.

(a) Section Heading.—The section heading of section 399M of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 280g-1) is amended

"SEC. 399M. EARLY DETECTION, DIAGNOSIS, AND TREATMENT REGARDING DEAF AND HARD-OF-HEARING NEWBORNS,

(b) STATEWIDE SYSTEMS.—Section 399M(a) of the Public Health

INFANT" and inserting "NewBorn, INFANT, AND YOUNG CHILD",

(2) in the matter preceding paragraph (1). Service Act (42 U.S.C. 280g-1(a)) is amended—

(2) in the matter preceding paragraph (1)

(A) by striking "newborn and infant" and inserting "providers," and inserting "providers whom infant and young child"; and

"Develop a state/territory plan to expand infrastructure, including data collection and reporting, for hearing screening for children up to age 3 ..."


