

Subject: 2024 EHDI State Stakeholders' Meeting – Message to Students

What is the State Stakeholders' Meeting, and when is it?

The goal of the EHDI Annual Conference is to enhance the implementation of comprehensive state-based Early Hearing Detection and Intervention (EHDI) programs. The Stakeholders' meeting is a time for states/territories to meet to discuss topics important to their Early Hearing Detection and Intervention (EHDI) programs. The goal of the stakeholder meetings is to build upon information and networking opportunities established during the conference.

NEW for 2024:

State/Territory Stakeholder Meetings have immense value within the EHDI System. In the past, a time was designated for these meetings during the conference, but we are planning something new this year. For 2024, most Stakeholder Meetings will be held outside of the EHDI Conference. They can be held in advance of the conference and/or as a follow up to the conference. There is also limited availability for some meetings to be held onsite in Denver; however, the meetings would take place outside of the conference session schedule.

Why should students attend?

This is a great time to see the “moving parts” of how state/territory EHDI programs and system stakeholders' work together to meet the needs that are important to them. It is also a great place to network and meet people! If you didn't indicate on your registration form which state/territory meeting you would like to attend, then go ahead and send an email to the EHDI Coordinator of that state/territory and introduce yourself as a student and let them know that you would like to attend their meeting. Since the EHDI Coordinators typically contact all the registrants from their state/territory just prior to arriving onsite, you could also inquire if there were materials shared with others that you could have as well.
